Ask someone what helps them feel connected and included at work.

Write their name and answer:



Check in with someone you haven't spoken to recently.

Do one small thing to make a colleague's working day better.

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INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 Download and print the Friendship Bingo card**
Print enough copies for your team and place a few extras in a shared area.
- 2 Give everyone time to complete the challenges**
Encourage employees to speak with colleagues, discover something new, and write the person's name or answer in each box..
- 3 Pin completed cards on a visible wall**
Create a Friendship Wall where people can display their completed bingo cards and celebrate the connections they made.
- 4 Invite people to share what they learnt**
At the end of the activity, ask your team to share one new thing they discovered about a colleague or one new connection they made.
- 5 Keep the connection going**
This resource is perfect for International Day of Friendship, but it can also be used anytime you want to spark conversation (icebreakers), strengthen relationships, and bring more connection into the workplace.



Perky Tip

The goal isn't just to complete the card — it's to create small moments of connection that help people feel more seen, included, and connected at work.
